
Today's Woman in Music

Clara Schumann (1819-1896) was a German pianist, composer, and teacher. A child prodigy, she began touring Europe as a pianist at age eleven. She and her husband Robert Schumann had eight children, and the couple were friends and supporters of the composer Johannes Brahms. Clara premiered many of her own, her husband's, and Brahms's works and often toured with violin virtuoso Joseph Joachim. She edited the publication of her husband's works. Several movies have been made about her life, and her image was on the 100 Detusche Mark note from 1989 to 2002.
